

# Use

Protective gloves against chemicals and micro-organisms for a limited period of time. These gloves have been tested and certified against BS EN 420:2003+AI:2009, EN ISO 374-I:2016, EN ISO 374-5:2016, EN 455-I:2000, EN 455-2:2015, EN 455-3:2015 and EN II86-I:2002 indicated by the markings applied to the glove packaging and shown below, in accordance with the PPE Regulation (EU) 2016/425. The gloves should therefore only be used for protection against the specific risks identified by the pictograms and test results below. Performance can be significantly affected by chemical concentration, temperature and mixture.

ISO 374-1:2016 – Protective gloves against dangerous chemicals and micro-organisms – Part I: Terminology and performance requirements for chemical risks

K = Sodium hydroxide 40%. CAS number: I310-73-2. Class: Inorganic base. Permeation level 6/ Degradation level -38.4%

T = Formaldehyde 37%. CAS number: 50-00-0. Class: Aldehyde. Permeation level 5/ Degradation level 46.6%

P = Hydrogen peroxide 30%. CAS number: 7722-84-I. Class: Peroxide. Permeation level 2/ Degradation level 17.6%

EN 374-4: 2013 Degradation results indicate the change in puncture resistance of the gloves after exposure to the challenge chemical

Each combination of protective glove/test chemical shall be classified according to Table I below, using the results as given in EN 16523-1:2015, 8.5.1.1 or 8.5.1.3 for the normalized breakthrough time. For Type B gloves, the permeation performance shall be at least level 2 against minimum of three test chemicals listed in Table 2 overleaf.

Gloves comply with the requirements given in EN 420:2009, Clause 4, Clause 5 and Clause 7, and meet the requirements of EN ISO 374-5:2016 for resistance to penetration by blood-borne pathogens-test method using Phi-XI74 bacteriophage.

WARNING! This information does not reflect the actual duration of protection in the workplace and the differentiation between mixtures and pure chemicals. The penetration resistance has been assessed under laboratory conditions and relates only to the tested specimen. The chemical resistance has been assessed under laboratory conditions from samples taken from the palm only (except in cases where the glove is equal to or over 400 mm - where the cuff is tested also) and relates only to the chemical tested. It can be different if the chemical is used in a mixture. It is recommended to check that the gloves are suitable for the intended use because the conditions at the workplace may differ from the type test depending on temperature, abrasion and degradation. When used, protective gloves may provide less resistance to the dangerous chemical due to changes in physical properties. Movements, snagging, rubbing, degradation caused by the chemical contact etc. may reduce the actual use time significantly. For corrosive chemicals, degradation can be the most important factor to consider in selection of chemical resistant gloves. Testing details are available upon request using the contact information shown above.

### Precautions for use

- I. These gloves are designed for single use only do not re-use.
- 2. Protection is limited to part of the hand only.
- 3. Before usage, inspect the gloves for any defect or imperfections (e.g. cuts or holes). Do not use damaged gloves. If in doubt, do not use the gloves.
- 4. Do not use where there is a risk of entanglement.
- 5. Do not use near a naked flame or sources of extreme heat.
- 6. Not suitable for protection against ionising radiation.
- Not for use in explosive environments.
- B. The gloves should only be used for splash protection of, or short contact with, chemicals.
- Ensure that chemicals cannot enter via the cuff and that no chemicals come into contact with the skin, even if they are assumed to be harmless.
- 10. Before removal, gloves should be cleaned of any contamination.
- II. Do not reverse the gloves.
- 12. The gloves have not been tested against mechanical or thermal risk, and should not be used in applications which require protection against these risks.

## Ingredients/Hazardous Ingredients

Some gloves may contain ingredients, which could potentially cause irritation / allergic reaction. In case of any adverse reaction / irritation, seek medical advice.

**Storage:** When not in use, store the product in a dry place away from direct sunlight, sources of contamination and extremes of temperature. **Cleaning:** These gloves are not suitable for washing. Do not launder or wash.
